Memorial Blocks at St. Bernard

At St. Bernard there are two raised beds with an angel statue surrounded by flowers. The blocks that cap the raised beds were sold to parishioners and were engraved with memorials in honor of loved ones or for those who had passed away. Over the years the engraving has deteriorated to the point that some of the blocks are unreadable. The St. Bernard CWC has graciously offered to redo the blocks. There is a list of the blocks elsewhere in this newsletter.

The old blocks have already been removed and have been placed along the edge of the parking lot between the church and the garage. If you purchased one of the old blocks you are welcome to take it. If you do not want it then the parish will dispose of it.

The new blocks are in place but have not been engraved. **If you purchased one of the old blocks and want the new one to be engraved the same way then you don't need to do anything.** If you would like to make changes to the new block there is \$35 fee for the cost of engraving. Please let us know of the changes as soon as possible.

If you would like to purchase a block there is a \$35 fee. Please let us know as soon as possible what you would like printed on the block.


Please note that all of the blocks will be printed with the same font and that there is a limited number of lines and characters on the line.

Notes from the Pastor

What I'm Reading: Sometimes it's a good idea to go back and review things. Lately I have been looking through some books that I have read before. One of them is *Orthodoxy* by G. K. Chesterton, where he talks about how he converted to Catholicism. He is very much the intellectual, which makes his conversion that much more surprising. He makes a lot of interesting points, but he tends to be long winded.

How About that New Pope?: So far, everything that I have seen about Pope Leo XIV is looking good. The word is that he will bring people together and heal some of the divisions in the Church. It's a tall order, but he may be the man to do it.

Is Five Quarterbacks Enough?: In football, the saying goes, "If you have two quarterbacks then you don't have a quarterback." Although a team typically will have three quarterbacks on the roster, the starter is far and away the better of the three and the other two are there in case the starter gets hurt. The Browns have five, count them, five quarterbacks, and none of them stand out. It's going to be a long season.

St. Bernard Parish Council – May 19th

Problems finding compact fluorescent light bulbs: The lights in the main body of the church use two different sized light bulbs, both of which are compact fluorescent lights (CFL). These bulbs are hard to find. We have found some LED bulbs with a similar brightness and color. We hope that they are close enough that people don't notice.

Problems finding four foot fluorescent bulbs: The majority of the light fixtures on both floors of the Hall and in the basement of the church use standard four foot fluorescent bulbs. Although common in older constructions, they have been replaced with more efficient and less toxic to dispose of LED fixtures. While we are still able to purchase the fluorescent bulbs, we need to plan for a time when they are no longer widely available. We have not been able to find LED lights that are a direct replacement for the fluorescent bulbs. This means that the long term solution is to replace all of the fluorescent fixtures with LED fixtures. This may be a significant issue in effort and cost. The Maintenance Committee is currently looking into this issue.

Sprinkler system in Hall checked: Brewer Fire of Charleston, WV, was recently called in to check the sprinkler system. This needs to be done on a yearly basis. No problems were found.

Fire suppression system in Hall checked: There is a hood over the gas ovens in the kitchen in the Hall. This needs to be checked on a yearly basis. Franklin Fire Equipment Company of Marietta recently checked the hood and no problems were found. The technician mentioned that the hood in the Hall at St. James is not really necessary, although it was checked last year and some minor repairs were made.

Problems with icemaker in the Hall: The icemaker in the kitchen has been a source of problems lately. There was discussion that it is not worth the effort and that we should just buy a small freezer and purchase bagged ice. This was unacceptable to the CWC. It was decided that normally the icemaker should be left off. It can be turned on the night before it is needed and then turned back off when the event is over. This has already been done several times and it seems to be working well. There was concern that this solution may be hard on the icemaker and that it may lead to some problems with mildew or other issues. We need to monitor this.

Broken window in the garage has been fixed: The parish would like to thank Jordan Hendershot for fixing the window. He said that there were some issues making it fit properly but that he was able to shim in the gaps so that there are no leaks. It was noted that no items in the garage bay were damaged while the window was broken.

Re-engraving of the memorial blocks on the raised beds: The old memorial blocks have been removed and have been made available to the parish. The new un-engraved blocks have been put in place by Green Leaf. It was noted that only a handful of the older blocks have been taken. There was discussion that the blocks are only engraved on one side and that they can still be used. It was recommended that we give the parish a few more weeks to pick up the blocks and then offer them to anybody who wants them.

It was noted that only a few people have shown interest in having new blocks engraved. It was also noted that so far there has been no interest in changing any of the blocks that have already been engraved. There was discussion that we should wait a few more weeks before the new blocks are engraved.

We asked Green Leaf about leveling out the raised bed that has sunk. They originally thought that they would be able to shim it back to level, but after looking at it they said that the whole bed would have to be redone. This would be a significant issue, though we may want to look into it later.

Digital sign in front of the church: The CWC floated the idea of replacing the sign in front of the church with a digital sign similar to the one at the fire station or in front of the Beverly United Methodist Church. It might be possible to get a 4' by 6' outdoor single-sided LED panel for as little as about \$4,000 and mount it on the current sign in front of the church. There was no interest in doing this.

Cremation wall niche engraving: Members of the Cemetery Association Board met with Jim Miller about engraving one of the niches. It was decided that Fr. Tim would purchase a niche and would pay for the engraving. There was discussion about the details of the engraving and Jim Miller was given a full size layout. Jim Miller has since contacted us with his own layout, which the Board has approved. We expect to have the engraved niche soon.
